- Tame Grass 1,467
- Cover Crops 2,154

- Fence and water developments

 - Boundary Fence 54,975 feet
 - Water developments
 - Wetland Creations 3
 - Wetland Enhancements 3
 - Dugouts 4
 - Water Tanks 47
 - Water Pipeline 70,754
- Approved grazing system on file to receive cost-share



AG ENERGY PROJECTS

- Combination of all practices can be utilized
 - Invasive Tree removal
 - Saline soil remediation (non-legacy sites)
- Land reclamation on private lands where there is no responsible party
- Associated with Energy Development


